WorldGBC comes home
to Toronto, Canada, in June,
for Congress 2018



WorldGBC is [delighted to announce](#) that its Congress 2018 will be held in Toronto, Canada - the birthplace of the organisation - in partnership with the Canada Green Building Council's (CaGBC) Building Lasting Change conference.

Taking place from 3 to 7 June, the event - titled "Building Lasting Change with WorldGBC Congress Canada" - will combine CaGBC's conference with a WorldGBC International Stream, and WorldGBC's annual Members' Day and related events such as its Board, Corporate Advisory Board, and Established GBC CEO Network meetings.

WorldGBC will lead the 'International Stream: Insights from the World's Green Building Leaders and Experts', which will feature a number of sessions including approaches and projects for net zero carbon buildings; major trends in urban planning with inspiration from the world's cutting-edge cities; and groundbreaking insights into green building and health, wellbeing and productivity, generated from case studies from around the world.

Our Europe Regional Network (ERN) has published [a report](#) as part of a new series which sets out the actions needed to ensure mortgage lending can support the EU's climate and building renovation goals. Published under the EU-funded '[Energy Efficient Mortgages Action Plan](#)' (EeMAP) Initiative, the report examines how energy efficient mortgages could work in terms of the underlying building performance assessment, and how they can support mortgage lenders and borrowers. The initiative has been welcomed by major banks, such as BNP Paribas and Unicredit, and was recently featured in the Irish edition of [The Sunday Times](#). Panel sessions across the two events span topics including how green building can help achieve the [UN Sustainable Development Goals](#) and how to access finance for large-scale energy efficiency building projects.
